Growth Habit:

• Beefmaster tomatoes are indeterminate, meaning they continue to grow and produce fruit throughout the season.

Best Uses:

• These large tomatoes are ideal for slicing and adding to sandwiches or burgers, and they can also be used in salads or for canning.

Growing Information:

- Choose a location with full sun (6-8 hours of direct sunlight daily) and well-draining soil with a pH of 6.4 to 6.8.
- Start seeds indoors 5 to 6 weeks before the last frost, and transplant seedlings outdoors after hardening off.
- Space plants 24 to 36 inches apart and provide support using stakes or cages.
