Growth Habit:

Best Uses:

 These large tomatoes are perfect for slicing and adding to sandwiches, burgers, or salads. They can also be used for grilling, canning, and making sauces.

Growing Information:

- Beefsteak tomatoes require full sun and well-draining soil with a pH of 6.0 to 6.8.
- Start seeds indoors 6 to 8 weeks before your last frost date, and transplant seedlings outdoors after hardening off.
- Space plants 24 to 36 inches apart, and provide support using stakes or cages due to the large fruit size.

Maintenance Information:
