# **Sungold Tomatoes (Heirloom)**

**Growth Habit:** Indeterminate, with long vines that continue to grow and produce fruit until frost. These vigorous plants can reach heights of 6 to 8 feet tall and require support from stakes, cages, or trellises. **Best Uses:** Fresh eating, snacking, salads, and garnishes. Known for their incredibly sweet, tropical flavor and golden-orange color, these cherry tomatoes are perfect for a variety of culinary applications that require a burst of sweetness.

## **Growing Information:**

- Full sun (at least 6 hours of direct sunlight)
- Well-draining, fertile soil with a pH of 6.0 to 6.8
- Start seeds indoors 6 to 8 weeks before the last frost
- Transplant seedlings outdoors after hardening off
- Space plants 24 to 36 inches apart

## Maintenance Information:

- Water consistently, providing 1 to 2 inches of water per week
- Fertilize with a balanced tomato fertilizer every 3 to 4 weeks
- Prune suckers and lower leaves to encourage fruit production and maintain plant structure
